

ORDINANCE NO. 17

AN ORDINANCE OF GOODING COUNTY, IDAHO, AMENDING SECTION 5, OF ORDINANCE NO. 12 BY PROVIDING THAT THE ORDINANCE BE EFFECTIVE FOR A PERIOD OF 210 DAYS AND DECLARING IT AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Gooding County Board of Commissioners have passed Ordinance No. 12 and desire to extend the period of time during which the Ordinance will be effective;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Board of County Commissioners of Gooding county, Idaho.

SECTION 1

THAT Section 5 of Ordinance No. 12 be amended to read as follows:

The Board of County Commissioners of Gooding County find that an impending danger requires the immediate operation of this Ordinance; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in effect upon the proclamation of the Board of County Commissioners posted in at least five places in the County. This Ordinance shall be effective for 210 days.

SECTION 2

The Board of County Commissioners of Gooding County find that the question of the dangers existing at the time of the enactment of the original Ordinance No. 12 has not, as of yet, been resolved because there has been no final decision from the Rim Moratorium Hearing Commission as to the exact nature and extent of the dangers, if any, in the canyon rim area arising from possible development along the canyon rim; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in effect upon the proclamation of the Board of County Commissioners posted in at least five places in the County.

After due consideration, it was moved by Commissioner Wilkins, Seconded by Commissioner LeMoyne, that the foregoing Ordinance be approved and adopted as an official act of this Board, to be effective upon the posting as stated in Section 2 hereof. Chairman LeMoyne put the motion to a vote, which was passed by Commissioner Wilkins and Commissioner LeMoyne voting in the affirmative and Commissioner Brailsford abstaining from voting.
