JAIL INSPECTION

The Board conducted their quarterly jail inspection. No adverse findings.

AMENDA AGENDA

SHERIFF VEHICLES

Commissioner Bolduc reported that the Sheriff's office vehicles have increased in price considerably. They have the option of purchasing the vehicles that have been on a lease for the residual amount.

PJ Curtis, Coroner, has one of his deputies that will be attending training. He is trying get the training sponsored by the Idaho Coroners Associations.

Karl Souza, Building and Grounds, is busy with construction and getting ready for spring. He has been working on the Coroners office and evidence room for the Sheriff's office. Don Gill, Fair Manager, has been busy with high school rodeo held at the fairgrounds, last weekend and working on another rodeo that will be held later this month. There is a circus scheduled this year. Jasen Parker, Weed Superintendent, is starting to do spraying. Carol Johnson, Chief Juvenile Probation, reported that their case loads are going up. Pro Active is building a crisis center in Twin Falls. Camas county has asked to meet with the Misdemeanor and Juvenile, chief probation officers. Treasurer Wines reported that the tax deed sale has been cancelled. Warrants of Dstraint are still out there. Mario de Haro Marti, Extension Office, explained that they have had personnel changes, Jenny has three camps this summer and Cindy Kinder has a couple of activities scheduled this summer. There were sixty-six dairy head at weigh in. Cathy Harris, Planning and Zoning, explained residential building has slowed down, Commercial building has been increasing. Tracey Martin, Chief Misdemeanor Probation, went to an instructor training at POST. She plans to move Urinary Analysis testing to Pro Active while the Court House is under constructions. Parole Violations are on the rise. PERSI's rule of 80 is not available for the Probations Chiefs. Clerk Gill reminded all to get their FY2024 budget requests in. Commissioner Buhler reported that Southern Idaho Solid Waste is exploring on to recycling. They have had offers from different companies. Commissioner Bolton reported that they have hired ETS, Eminent Technical Solutions, to do IT Services, for the county. It is a yearly contract with ETS.

TAX CANCELLATION
